
Rechartering

This scholarship is awarded based on school and Scouting participation, academic performance, and financial need. Applicants must meet the minimum SAT (1290) or an ACT (28) score to be considered. This scholarship is awarded as follows: \$48,000 – One awarded annually, \$25,000 – Four awarded annually (One per BSA region). ## North Shore at Philmont 2019


