




Order of the Arrow

Webelos Woods/Webelos Day Event Saturday, November 9, 2019 9 AM - 12 PM Brushy Creek Lake Park

Due to issues in acquiring a place to hold the Fall Camporee/Webelos Woods, we will not be having a traditional campout this year.

Instead, we are going to have a day event on Saturday, November 9th. This event will be a recruiting event, not only for Webelos but also for Troops, Crews and the Ship. This will be a great way for each unit to show what they have to offer all prospective Scouts.

We are looking for volunteers to help plan the event. We are planning to have a patch to commemorate the event. This Scouting event will count for the Webelos Arrow of Light requirement to attend a Scouts BSA event.

We currently have 2 of the largest pavilions reserved at Brushy Creek Lake Park. The basic plan would be for each Unit to come up with a "Demonstration Area" similar to what we have done at previous Webelos Woods. The Units would set up early on Saturday morning from 7 am - 9 am. The event would start at 9 am and last until 12 pm. We would breakdown and clean up with the goal to be completed by 1 pm. Part of the day would be taking part in a conservation/service project for the park.

The District Committee doesn't like to cancel anything. This is always the last resort. In looking ahead for 2020 we are currently trying to secure a location for the Spring Camporee. The OA is already starting to plan that event
