

A Request from District Advancement

Do you know one of the greatest experiences we have as Adults in Scouting? It is sitting on a scout's Board of Review. We get to sit down with a youth and talk to them about their experiences, achievements and goals. This happens at the Unit level as the youth advances in rank. For the Eagle Board of Review, the Scout is required to meet with a group of Adults from the Scout's unit and at least one from the District. This is where you come in. You don't even have to be a Scoutmaster or Assistant Scoutmaster: "they must have an understanding of the rank and the purpose and importance of the review" (from the Guide to Advancement). Last year we had 51 Eagle Scouts from North Shore and we've already had 33 this year with more scheduled in the near future.

The District needs volunteers from <u>EVERY</u> unit to help deliver a meaningful experience to each of these Scouts. If we have enough volunteers, then each of us would only be asked to sit on a couple Eagle Board of Reviews per year.

Recharter

Recharter Training at October Roundtable

What is "recharter"?

What happens during recharter? Basically, you're telling BSA:

- Who is "in" for next year? (existing youth and adults, plus new members)
- Who is "out" for next year? (existing members who are dropping out of the program)

"Please bring your Unit's Roster for 2020." What does that mean? It means you have already determined which current members are staying with the Unit for 2020. This includes Webelos and Adults in Cub Scout Packs that will be crossing over (and therefore transferring) to Scouts BSA Troops in early in 2020. This should also include all the Youth and Adult applications that were received during your Fall JSN or any other new applications. You should always submit any application to the Scout office as soon as possible. This will minimize the amount of paper you will be required to submit with your Recharter. Remember all Adult applications will require proof of Youth Protection Training (YPT).

To prepare for Recharter you should check your Roster against what the Council has registered for your unit. You can get this roster by asking any of the KEY 3 for your Unit to download the roster from my.scouting.org.

Rectifying the difference between these two rosters is what Recharter is about.

To accomplish this, the annual charter renewal process is essentially four steps:

- 1. Gather necessary information on youth and adult members
- Gather membership applications (youth and adults) and verification of Youth Protection Training (adults only)
- 3. Enter the information through the BSA's Internet Charter Renewal website
- 4. Print your charter renewal documents from Internet Charter Renewal, review those documents with your Unit Commissioner, and then submit the "Unit Charter Renewal Report Package" to our Council office.
- This year the National Council is requiring that each registered adult, new or
 existing, must complete a new background check authorization form. See link
 below to download the form and turn in all the signed forms with your Recharter
 packet.

Background Check Authorization

Your unit should also complete the application for the Journey To Excellence Award.
