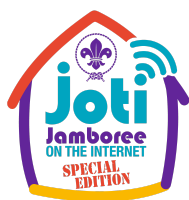

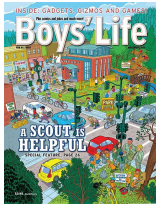

## Tips for Virtual Scouting Meetings:

- Emphasize that the meeting is an official BSA meeting
- Adhere to Youth Protection guidelines
  - The [Guide to Safe Scouting](#) applies to ALL Scout gatherings, even virtual meetings.
  - [Youth Protection Guidelines](#) apply to ALL Scout gatherings, even virtual meetings
- Set expectations: normal unit uniforming/attire should be worn
- Begin meetings with the Pledge of Allegiance
- Include the Scout Oath and Law, as appropriate
- Include an opening invocation, as appropriate
- Where possible and appropriate, conduct the meeting in a manner similar to an in person meeting
- Where possible, close the meeting in accordance with your normal manner

## Order of the Arrow North Shore Chapter

Due to the coronavirus, we have had to cancel Camporee and April's chapter meeting. The council has not yet made a decision on the Spring Assembly, scheduled for May 1-3.



Elections: Most units in North Shore have held elections this year, but there are several that have yet to have an election. As of March 27, we expect that rules will still require an in-person election due to the nature of the confidential voting. As a result, any new election requests will be postponed indefinitely.

OA Callout: Given the cancellation of Camporee, the normal callout ceremony to introduce Ordeal candidates could not occur. As a result, the responsibility falls to the unit leaders to introduce the Ordeal candidates according to their preference. Last year, one troop wanted to ensure that Ordeal candidates were aware before Summer Assembly, so they announced the candidates at a May Court of Honor. If you are meeting virtually, names can be announced then as well. Note that results for all elections have been passed to the council so candidate letters should be available soon.

Brotherhood Ceremony: We had scheduled the ceremony to take place at Camporee, but obviously that was not possible. Once assemblies are authorized again, we will schedule a ceremony to take place one evening during the summer. More to come on that later.

In our May meeting, scheduled for May 9th, we expect to have the chapter officer election. We'd ask all OA members to consider an opportunity to serve in one of the following roles:

• Chapter Chief • Vice Chief of Programs • Vice Chief of Ceremonies • Vice Chief of Elections • Scribe

## Reading Around the World (in 80 Days)

This program was introduced in Pack 170 as part of their Summertime Pack Award activities for 2019. It encourages Scouts to read every day to earn “miles” for every minute they read. The goal is to circumnavigate the globe at the equator. The unit can design their own incentive program. Pack 170 did custom button-loop patches. The program essentials are:

- A Scout earns 5 miles for every minute of reading.
- Audiobooks sharpen many of the same skills as reading like vocabulary development and comprehension. They also assist in developing skills that reading may not, such as critical listening, while reading develops skills that audiobooks may not, like spelling. In any case, consideration should be made for listening to audiobooks, perhaps 5 miles per minute for those that struggle to read and 4 miles per minute for others.
- Parents should determine what their Scout(s) will read. Choose materials that will both entertain and challenge the Scout.
- Scouts should spend up to 30 additional minutes (5 miles/min) learning about a new place each week, selected by themselves, their parents, or the unit. The time spent on this activity counts towards their miles earned.
- Parents track the amount of time the Scout spends reading and records the “miles” earned.
- Weekly status reports should be sent to the program coordinator.
- Scouts / Families meet regularly at an interval set by the unit / participants (weekly, biweekly, monthly) to share what they learned / read. If an entire unit is participating, this could be done as part of a den, pack, or troop meeting.
- Once-a-month movie night. Select an appropriate movie, cook up some popcorn, serve water / juice and, enjoy a fun time. You may wish to select a movie set in a location your Scouts have read about that month or perhaps a movie based on one of the books. Of course, you could just let them choose one. We watched “Around the World in 80 Days” for our final movie night.
- While sheltering at home, you will need to get creative to achieve this, but it can be done. Possibilities include:
  - The Verge has published [4 ways to watch movies together online](#). You may need a subscription.
  - Choose a movie from a free source and have families watch at home together. [VUDU](#) offers free movies with a few commercial breaks spread throughout the movie.
  - [HULU](#), [Netflix](#), etc. (paid account required). Netflix offers the [Netflix Party app](#) for Chrome to enable group watching. [Kast](#) and other stream-sharing tools are also available.
  - Someone with a video conferencing account can share (video quality may vary).
- It takes roughly 11,000 miles to circumnavigate the globe at the Arctic (or Antarctic) Circle and 25,000 miles at the equator. Over the course of 80 days and using the reading rates listed above:
  - A Scout can circumnavigate the globe at the Arctic (or Antarctic) Circle by reading 25 minutes per day and completing the 30-minute weekly research.
  - A Scout can circumnavigate the globe at the equator by reading 1 hour per day and completing the 30-minute weekly research.
- Reading Around the World may be combined with other reading challenges, like the Round Rock Express’ “[Spike’s Reading Challenge](#)” (started March 23rd) or Scholastic’s “[Read-a-Palooza](#)”, or conducted separately. Combining with another reading program can provide additional incentives but may also introduce additional rules and restrictions.

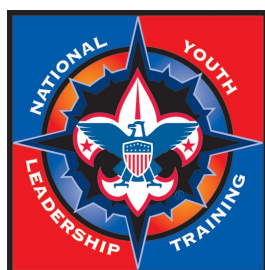


National Youth Leadership Training is a national BSA program that provides a fun way to learn and experience practical leadership skills and knowledge that each scout can apply in the home unit. Building on what scouts learn in their Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops, Crews, or Ships, NYLT explores leadership deeper so that each scout understands what a leader must be, know, and do. It is highly recommended for units to send qualified scouts who are ready for a leadership challenge.

In order to attend NYLT, Scouts BSA scouts must be registered in a unit, be at least 13, completed Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops and First Class, and have a Scoutmaster recommendation. Venturers and Sea Scouts must be at least 14, or 13 and completed 8th grade, completed Introduction to Leadership Skills for Crews or Ships, and have the Unit Leader's recommendation. Only 2 scouts from any unit may attend a single session to provide an optimal experience.

## North Shore Cub Day Camp (Twilight Camp)
