 This means we are an active troop! Here are our year's highlights in review.

 - 9 Camping events. (Normally 10-11)

 - 2 Court of Honor events (Normally do 3-4 per year)
 - 2 Swimming test days
 - 1 Canoeing day (our troop owns 7 canoes). (Normally 2-3)




















Troop 161 Demographics

Troop 161 Cost/Funding

- Fundraisers (Strictly voluntary, but necessary) earn money for your Scout account.
 - Popcorn
 - Mulch
- Dues \$10 per month
- Campout: Scout's typical food budget is \$7-\$10 per Scout. Adults usually spend approximately \$10+.
- Registration fees are set by National, same as Cub Scouts.

 - We camp from canoes similar to a backpacking campout.
 - We have backpacking resources within our troop.
